In 2021, the Potawatomi Area Council had a successful year, developing the next generation of community leaders and celebrated the 75th Anniversary of Camp Long Lake. As we kicked off the 75th celebration with a new event called

Opening Day, which brought over 600 Scouts and Scouters to Camp Long Lake. In addition, we had a memorable anniversary celebration in July, several Scouters from the past and present were able to attend, and many great Scouting stories were shared. The celebration culminated in a record attendance of 1,197 Scouts attending summer camp. 
I am grateful to all who helped make 2021 so successful, and I'm even more excited about building a greater future for Scouting and our community.




All funds solicited by the Potawatomi Area Council, BSA throughout the course of the year are generated through voluntary contributions from the public and are soley used for Scouting Programs.
